
Dear Great Neck High School Class of 1959,

. . . and own my own <u>airplane</u> . . .






After lunch, I flew to the <u>Linden Airport</u> (KLDJ) in <u>Linden, New</u> <u>Jersey</u>.



On Sunday morning, April 23, 2017, I had breakfast with Josie Pizer and Fred Giffords . . .




... at the Great Neck Diner.


After breakfast, we walked across the street to Fred's condo, where we relaxed before Fred drove us to the Westbury Manor . . .

The reception hall was beautifully decorated . . .




... and catered ...


Towards the end of the memorial celebration, Cindy Bloking gave moving and joyous a speech in honor and memory of her mother.
