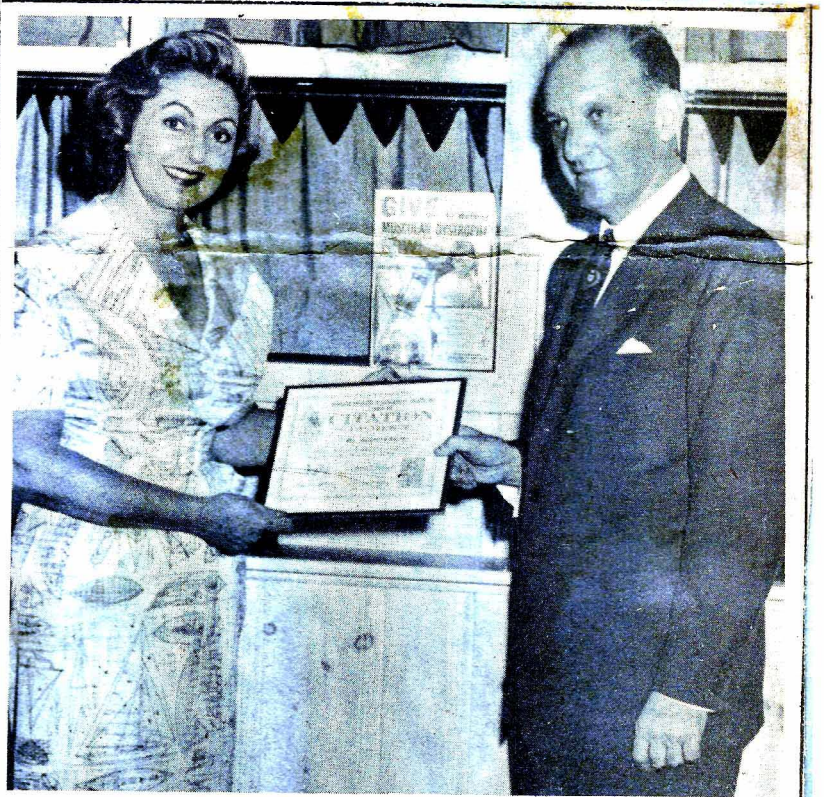

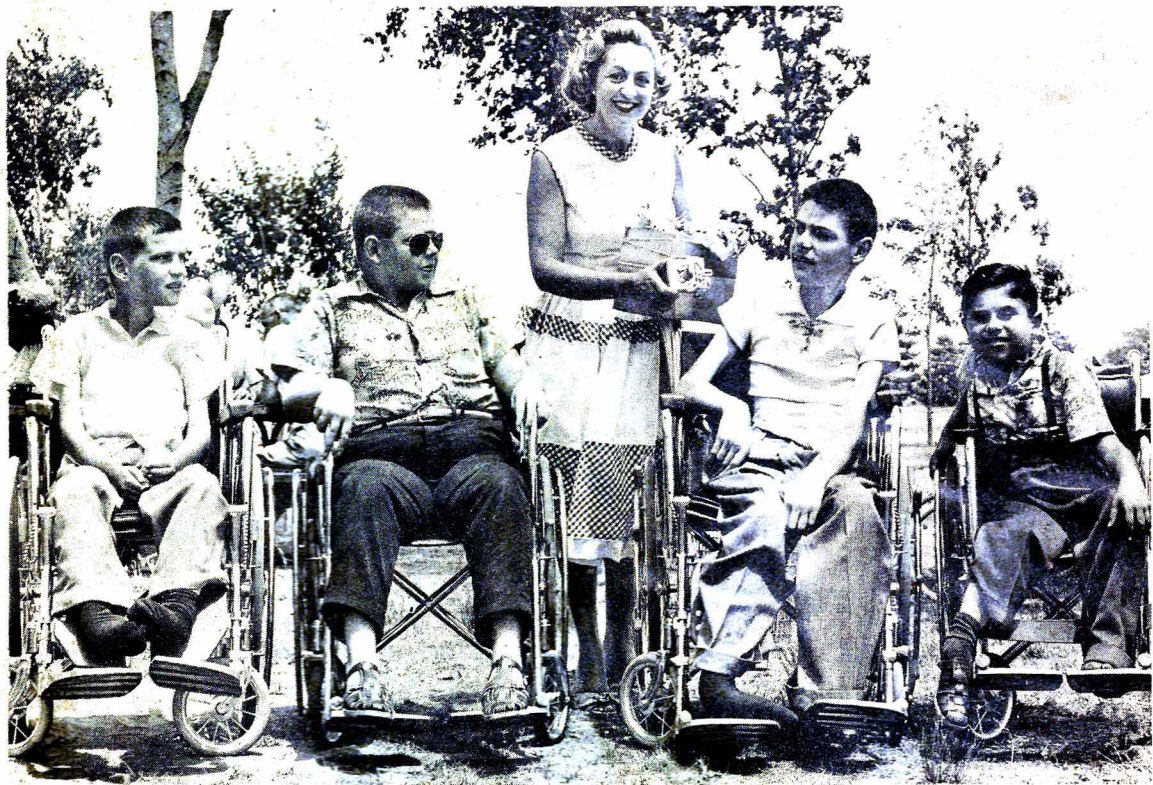

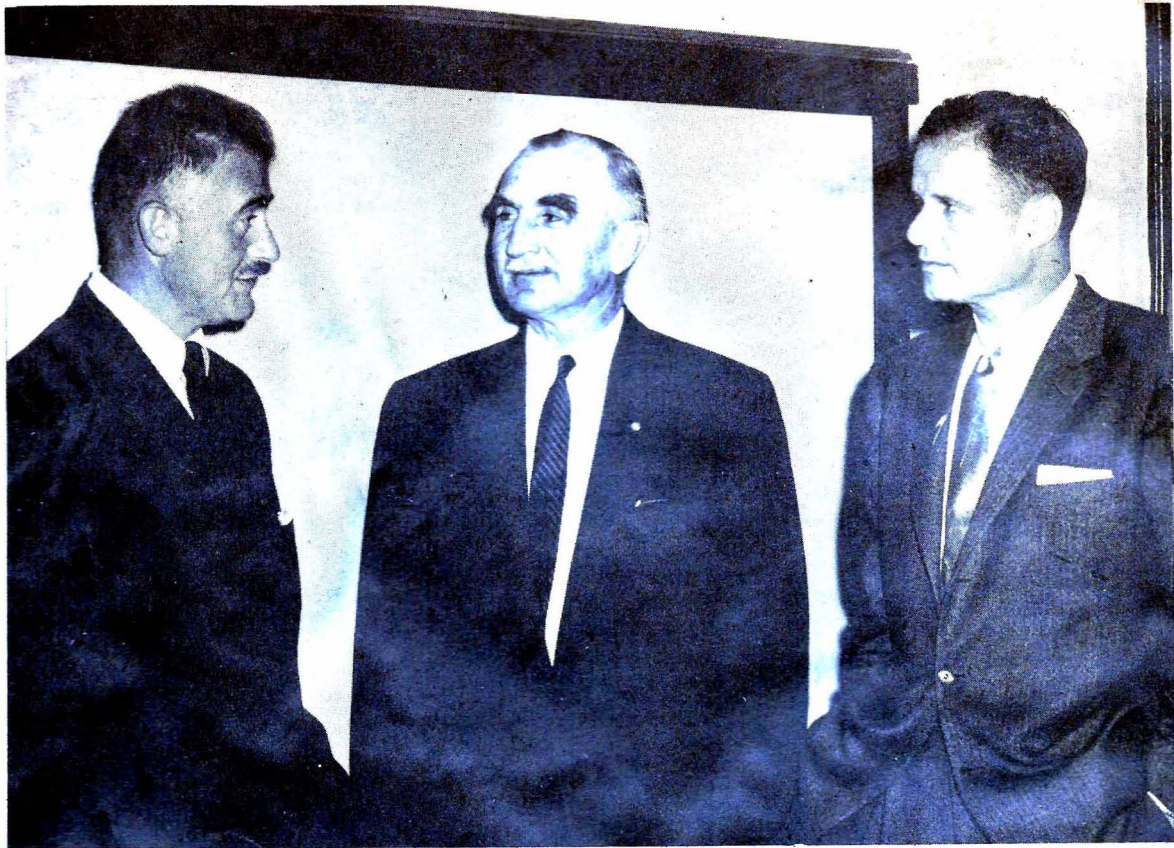

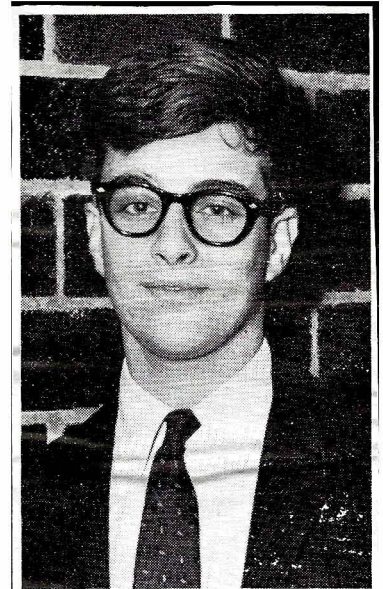

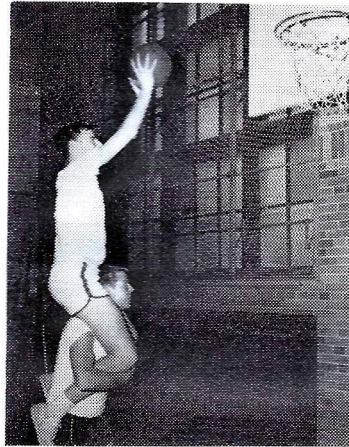
Will it Work?

ders. The duo will then proceed to stumble towards the basket. They will catch a pass. Spahn will drop it in for the two pointer.

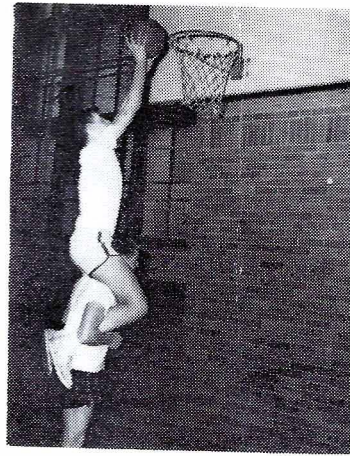

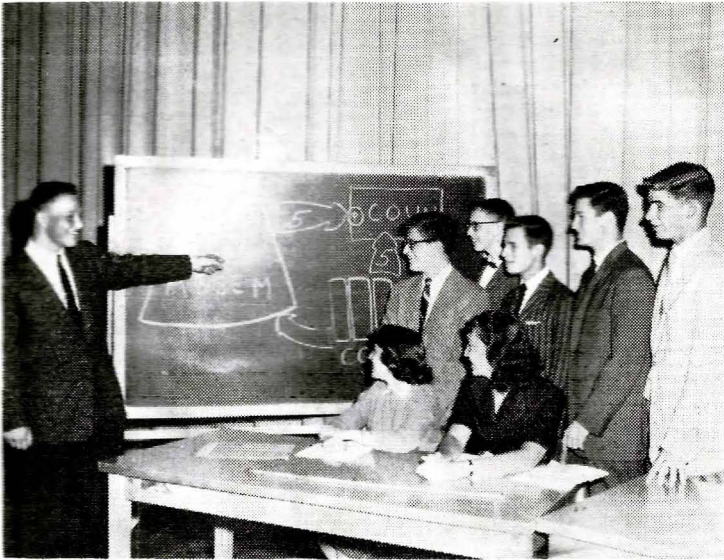

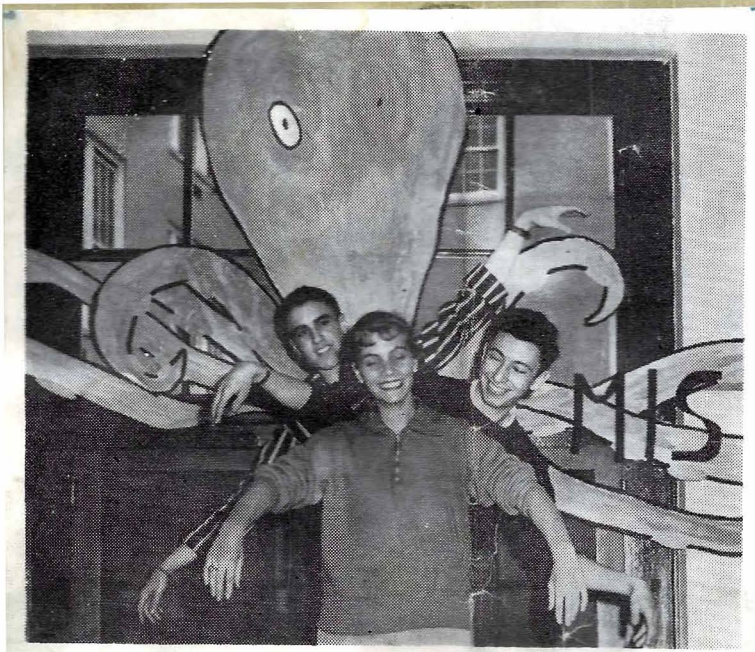

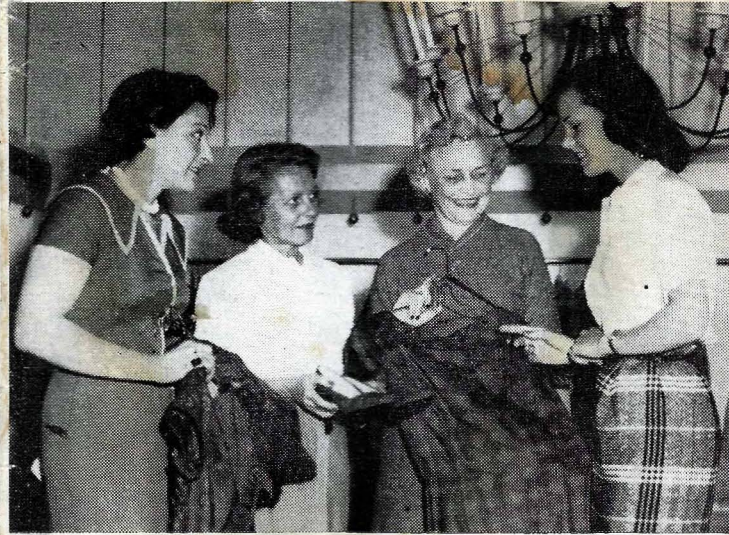

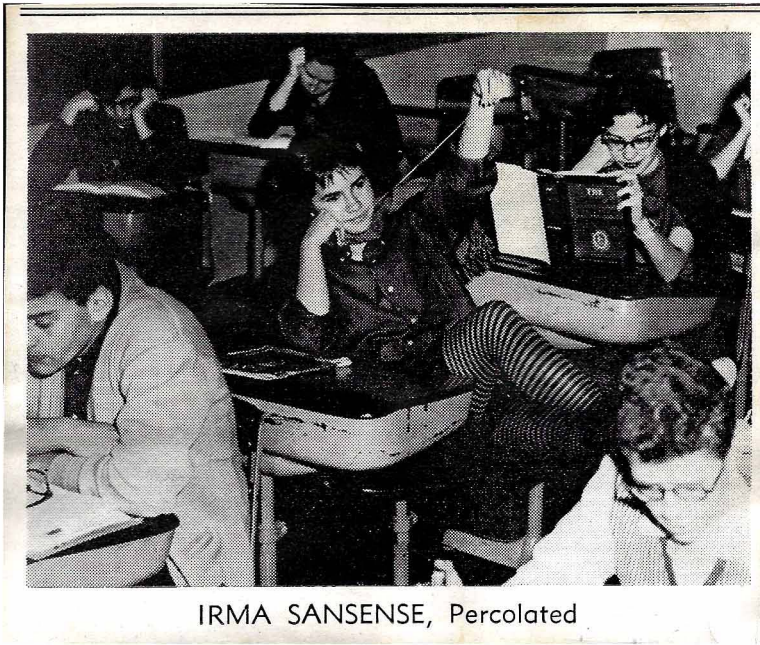

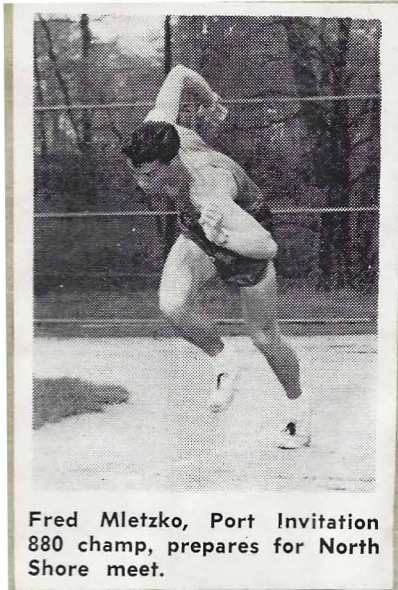

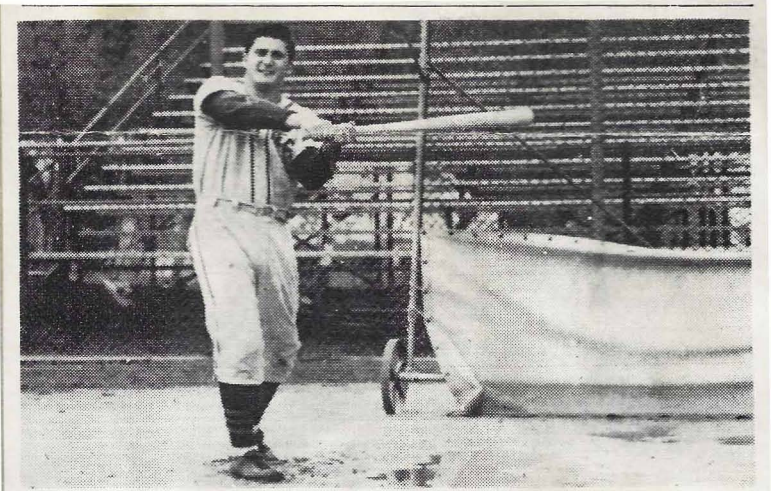

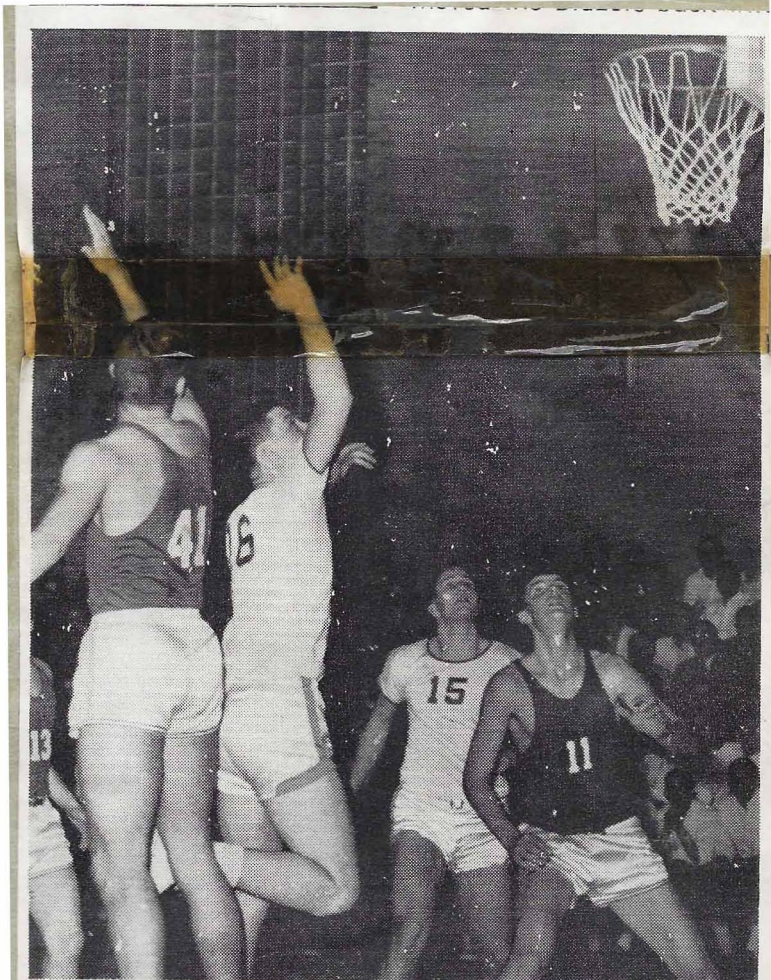
